Fife High School to Receive Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools National Banner at All-School Assembly on Wednesday, October 2

School earns national recognition for commitment to meaningful social inclusion for students with intellectual disabilities and for creating an accepting school environment

September 30, 2019 – **Seattle** – For its work in empowering students to be agents of change in their school and community, Special Olympics and ESPN will present Fife High School in Tacoma with a Unified Champion Schools national banner.

Fife High School is one of just five schools in the nation to receive national banner status this year for meeting 10 national standards of excellence. These standards revolve around inclusion, advocacy and respect and include implementing sustainable programs around Special Olympics Unified Sports (where students with and without intellectual disabilities train and compete as teammates), inclusive youth leadership and engagement throughout the whole school.

Fife High School will hold an all-school assembly to celebrate this achievement and to raise the national banner. Special guests participating in the assembly include ESPN analyst P.J. Carlesimo, Congressman Denny Heck and a surprise appearance by Governor Jay Inslee.
