# **Unified Sports & Schools**

Dedicated to promoting social inclusion through shared sports training and competition experiences, Unified Sports joins people with and without intellectual disabilities on the same team. It was inspired by a simple principle: training together and playing together is a quick path to friendship and understanding.

Through the Unified Schools program, this inclusive mentality moves off the playing field and into the classroom. A Special Olympics Unified Champion School is a combination of three components:

- Whole School Awareness and Involvement: activities that promote inclusion and reach the majority of the school population
- Inclusive Youth Leadership: students with and without intellectual disabilities work together to lead and plan advocacy, awareness, and other related inclusive activities
- Inclusive Sports: a fully inclusive sports or fitness program that combines an equal number of students with and without intellectual disabilities

# **Healthy Athletes**

Created in 1997, the Healthy Athletes program identifies and addresses the health disparities that people with intellectual disabilities face.

The program provides athletes with free health screenings, education, and referrals for follow-up care in a fun, welcoming environment that removes the barriers people with ID often encounter during a visit to a doctor, dentist, or other healthcare professional. The Healthy Athletes program is dedicated to changing the way health systems interact with people with intellectual disabilities.

In 2018, 191 clinical and wellness professionals were trained on providing care and education to people with intellectual disabilities through volunteering.



#### The Healthy Athletes program includes eight disciplines:

- Fit Feet (podiatry)
- FUNfitness (physical therapy)
- Health Promotion (better health and wellbeing)
- Healthy Hearing (audiology)
- MedFest (sports physical)
- Special Olympics-Lions Clubs International Opening Eyes (vision)
- Special Smiles (dentistry)
- Strong Minds (emotional wellbeing)



## Law Enforcement Torch Run

The Law Enforcement Torch Run® (LETR) campaign is the largest public awareness and grassroots fundraising vehicle for Special Olympics.



Known honorably as Guardians of the Flame, law enforcement members carry the Flame of Hope, symbolizing courage and celebration of diversity, uniting communities around the globe.

The LETR campaign for Special Olympics engages law enforcement worldwide championing acceptance and inclusion for people with intellectual disabilities, starting first with their own communities. Over the years, the campaign has evolved and now encompasses a variety of innovative fundraising platforms. Since its inception, the LETR campaign has raised more than \$790 million dollars and changed millions of attitudes.


