
Red Robin Tip-A-Cop

Meet Patricia Duemmell:

Patricia Duemmell has been involved with Special Olympics for over 15 years. It was back in the early 2000's that it all began. Having a background with running, her friend Commander Krusey thought she could inspire their department to run for Special Olympics and asked if she could attend a meeting for it

that next afternoon, and she gave a resounding "yes".

She went in to the meeting a bit skeptical on what it what would actually be about. She assumed it would be a meeting about running and how Special Olympics Washington was going to motivate them on how to get the run started, but she was wrong. The meeting turned out to be about how to raise money for Special Olympics. Pairing a great cause like this and a passion for running was all Patricia needed to be hooked. The rest is history.

Since then, she has created countless memories with Special Olympics Washington. A few that stand out the most in her memory are her 'Border to Base' run from the Idaho board line to Fort Lewis, Spring Games at Marysville-Pilchuck High School, and being with her grandson on her path from Marysville PD to Fort Lewis and watching him wave at all the runners.

"So many athletes have made me cry with pride," she says. "Their smiles are worth a gold medal, their hugs are very special - for some they cannot hug but their look is priceless, and the thank you's are worth a million gold medals."

Her hopes and dreams for Special Olympics and LETR in Washington State is that they will continue to grow together forever. She hopes that more agencies get involved and see the miracle that the coaches and athletes bring to their families and to themselves. She knows that some agencies may say, "It's work or it's my day off" or they just don't have time to spare. But Patricia knows that when you get that big hug and thank you from the coaches, athletes, and family members - it's worth every minute.
