GENERAL DIRECTIONS BELOW MAY HELP - CHECK ROUTE BEFORE YOU TRAVEL:

From Spokane: Head West on I-90. At exit 220, take ramp right for US-395 South toward Pasco. Take ramp right for I-82 West toward Richland/Pendleton. From I-182 take Road 68 exit, go right out Rodeo, right onto Convention Place, left on Homerun Road

From Yakima: Head East on I-82 toward Richland. At exit 102 take ramp right for I-182 East toward Richland/ Pasco. From I-182 take Road 68 exit, go right out Rodeo, right onto Convention Place, left on Homerun Road.

From Wenatchee: Take WA-281 North. Takeramp rightfor I-90 Westtoward Seattle. At exit 137, take ramp rightfor WA-26 East toward Othello/Richland. Keep straight onto SR-26. Turn right onto SR-243. Bear right onto SR-24. Keep straight onto SR-240. Turn right to stay on SR-240/By bass Hwy. Takeramp for I-182 East. From I-182 take Road 68 exit, go right out Rodeo, right onto Convention Place, left on Homerun Road

From Moses Lake: Take SR-17 toward Pasco. Take ramp right and follow signs for US-395 South. Take ramp right for I-82 West toward Richland/Pendleton. From I-182 take Road 68 exit, go right out Rodeo, right onto Convention Place, left on Homerun Road.

From Clarkson: Turn left onto Bridge St (US-12)/Turn right onto Owens Rd/Turn left onto Lewis and Clark Trail Hwy(WA-127) toward US-12 W/Walla Walla/Continue on Preston Ave (WA-124)/Turn right onto Main St (WA-124)/Turn left onto W 2nd St (WA-124)/Turn right and take ramp onto W Highway 12 (US-12 W)/Continue on I-182 (Lewis and Clark Trail Hwy)/Take exit 9 toward Road 68/Turn right onto N Road 68/Turn right onto Rodeo Dr/Turn right onto Convention Pl/Turn left onto Homerun Rd

GENERAL VENUE INFORMATION:

RESTROOMS: Located near the concession stand.

GARBAGE: The tournament grounds including the parking lot must be left in good repair, clear and litter free. Failure to do so will result in loss of part or all the SOWA deposit. **Please place all litter in a garbage container**. **SMOKING:** Smoking, vaping and tobacco use is prohibited in all City of Pasco buildings and within 20 ft. from any playground structure.

PETS: No pets are allowed inside the Pasco Sporting complex gates (service animals must have credentials and be approved). Pet owners may walk their pets on the paths and in the grass areas **outside the gates**, but must always pick up after their animal and keep their pet under control according to the City of Pasco Ordinance # 8.04.050.

ALCOHOL: Alcoholic beverages and drugs are prohibited at all city owned parks, sports complexes, and facilities.

WEATHER: Bring sunscreen, baseball hats, coolers, and refillable water containers (water refill stations available at complex. Misters will be running over some of the bleachers if the weather is hot.

MERCHANDISE

Our merchandise table will be located near **COMMAND CENTER**. Along with our current SUMMER SEASON clothing, we will be selling our "past season" clothing at deeply reduced prices. **Cash / check / credit cards are all excepted**.

COMPETITION STYLE

SOFTBALL / T-BALL: will be a **double elimination competition**. Awards presented soon after each team completes their bracket and results posted. Individual Skills will be awarded soon after everyone has completed the Individual Skills Competition.

BOCCE BALL: will be a **round robin competition.** Awards presented soon after each team completes their bracket/division and results processed.

MEDICAL

American Medical Response continues to provide excellent medical care at our regional competitions and will be onsite for this competition! Stop by to let them know just how much we appreciate them.

We highly encourage each team to bring your own personal medical kit with you.... and, don't forget – coaches are required to carry current AFP and UP forms with them! FYI: A medical bag will also be kept at the COMMAND CENTER.

Application for Participation (AFP) - Unified Participation release (UP)

SOWA requires all participants to poses a current AFP / UP in order to participate during the season – that includes practice and competition! Coaches are **required to carry copies** of those forms while at practice and competitions. It is very important to keep those forms in a safe place as they contain personal information.

AWARDS



Awards will be presented near the designated area as results are processed and completed. **This is a state qualifying competition.**

We ask that all teams or individuals remain at the venue until their awards have been presented. If it becomes impossible to stay for the award presentation, the HEAD COACH is responsible to have a team or individual representative pick up the awards as they are presented and be responsible to deliver them to the recipients.

SUMMER STATE GAMES REGISTRATION

A quick turnaround - registration deadline for those advancing to our SUMMER STATE GAMES in Everett will be no later than <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>July 30th</u>. Required forms will be available on our <u>East Region Webpage</u>.

DIVISIONING INFORMATION

Special Olympics competitions provide teams and athletes with the opportunity to demonstrate sport skills they have acquired during training. Special Olympics teams and athletes strive for their best performance at each competition. Most regional competitions are also used to advance teams to our season's STATE GAMES based on their results and allowed state allocations (see "allocation" section for explanation).

TEAMS: Based on Special Olympics International's Article 1, teams are divisioned by age group and skill level. If necessary and safe, age groups may be divisioned together. However, allocations are adjusted so that the age groups are not competing against each other for a state invitation – we are simply looking for ways to provide regional competition.

In order to cultivate equitable competition, we try to division teams according to their level of play. Skill level is based on qualifying scores submitted by the coach during the FINAL REGISTRATION process and past season results if the team is basically made up of the same athletes/partners.

INDIVIDUAL SKILLS: Based on Special Olympics International's Article 1, athletes are divisioned by age, gender, and ability unless there are not enough participants to create a competitive division within these parameters. Divisions are generally created with a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 8 participants. However, if there are not enough participants to accommodate age, gender and ability while also abiding by the minimum and maximum division numbers, we may combine the categories above in order to cultivate equitable competition.... or, in some cases reduce the minimum number to 1 or 2.

In addition to using the guidelines above to cultivate equitable competition, we use the qualifying scores submitted on the INDIVIDUAL REGISTRATION FORM.

We will always strive to create the best divisions, however, there may be times when divisioning pairings fall short of our stated goals.

STATE SOFTBALL / BOCCE BALL ALLOCATIONS:

Here are how the state SOFTBALL / BOCCE BALL allocations (how many teams/individuals the EAST REGION can send) for our upcoming SUMMER STATE GAMES are determined:

Special Olympics Washington has divided the state into three regions – the East Region includes the areas of **North Central / Northeast / Southeast / Tri-Cities / Walla Walla / Valley** as shown on the map at the end of this manual:

The state office works from a pre-determined matrix (formula) in order to approve how many ALLOCATIONS a region is allowed. That matrix includes things such as: housing space / venue space / time restraints / volunteer availability / budget boundaries / etc.

The total ALLOCATION number must then be divided amongst the three regions. This is determined by calculating the number of teams/skills individuals representing each region. The number of ALLOCATIONS each region is awarded is proportionate (percentage) to the number of participants/teams the region reports.

The East Region SOFTBALL / BOCCE BALL allocations will be determined and announced just before our competition on July 27th.
