MINIMUM CRITERIA TO BECOME A CERTIFIED HEAD COACH

To receive SOWA head coach certification, an individual will:



- 1. View the Special Olympics Washington **General Orientation** online at sowa.org
- 2. Complete the **Protective Behaviors** online training and quiz, available at http://www.resources.specialolympics.org/protective_behaviors_training.aspx
- 3. Complete and submit the following:
 - a. Washington State Patrol Background Check
 - b. Volunteer Application, available at sowa.org
- 4. Complete an approved **Sports Specific Training** OR hold a valid coaching license
- 5. Complete and pass the following approved online or in-person courses:
 - a. Concussion Prevention
 - b. Sudden Cardiac Arrest Awareness (NFHSlearn.com)
- 6. Complete the **Coaching Unified Sports course** (NFHSlearn.com)* this course is **required** for Unified coaches and **highly recommended** for all coaches



CONTINUING EDUCATION

In order to maintain Special Olympics coach certification, coaches will need to complete five hours of approved continuing education courses, seminars or workshops, **every three years**. Examples include:

- Coaching Special Olympics Athletes course
- Coaching Unified Sports
- Special Olympics Principles of Coaching course
- SOWA sport update webinars
- First Aid/CPR
- Other courses as approved by Special Olympics Washington
